Introduction

With the stated deadline for Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) fast approaching in September 2015, the international society is in the process of discussing and finalizing the next set of goals to improve people's lives on this planet.

As a mid-term group project of a class titled "International Cooperation Policies," 127 students (sophomore or above) studying at the Faculty of Policy Studies in Doshisha University (Kyoto, Japan) discussed and came up with a goal that they think should be included as part of post-2015 development goals.

In a group of three to four, students studied the current MDGs, analyzed its progress and weaknesses, and proposed a new goal. The goal was to be accompanied by targets and indicators that help us measure and monitor the progress.

This short booklet presents list of goals proposed by the students, followed by examples of four-slide posters developed by five groups.






Indicators

Proposal of a New Development Goal Ensure Employment Opportunity


Targets

- 2. Increase women's participation in the workforce
- 3. Enhance support for young generation to get jobs



Reasons for Proposing the Goal and Targets

Figure 1. Global female and male unemployment, 2002–2017



Note: 2012 are preliminary estimates and 2013 onwards are preliminary projections.

The ILO(International Labor Organization) estimate 201.8 million jobless people in 2013. Among them, the main victims were young generations. 74.5 million people between age 15–24 were unemployed in 2013.

Indicators for Each Target

- 1. Unemployment Rate, Labor Force Rate
- 2. Women's Employment Rate, Gender Pay Gap, Number of programs that support women's social advancement
- 3. Employment Rate, Number of programs that support social advancement of young generations

Goal: Reduce victims of war

→ Many people today are suffering from war.

Target 1: Decrease the number of weapons

Target1: Decrease the number of weapons

Indicator 1: Increase the number of countries that have ratified international treaties

- Some countries still have not ratified the treaties (especially big and powerful ones)
- In order to decrease the number of weapons, these countries need to ratify the treaties.
- Only 44% countries in the Middle East and North Africa have ratified the treaties.
 - ⇒The percentage should increase to **70%**




Red are countries that have not ratified

Indicator 2 Limiting the Distribution of Small Weapons

- There are 600 million small weapons in the world
- 5 million were killed by small weapons in a year, of which 80% are women or children

Target2: Reduce the number of refugees



One of the main causes of refugee to war.

People lost almost everything including their house or family by war and fall down to refugee.

We should stop this situation beforehand and take care of the refugees.

Decrease the number of plague patients.

Targets

- A) Decrease the number of Ebola patients
- B) Decrease the number of cholera patients

Reasons

- These fatal disease are serious issues of the world.
- 100,000 to 120,000 people die from cholera every year.
- There are at least 15,935 Ebola patients, and 5,689 people have died from Ebola.

- A2) Number of people suffering from Ebola
- A₃) Percentage of cremated bodies
- A4) Number of new drugs for Ebola infection
- B1) Proportion of people with knowledge of infectious disease
- B2) Number of people suffering from Cholera
- B₃) Percentage of cremated bodies
- B4) Number of water supply and sewage facilities
- B₅) Number of treatment plants
- B6) Diffusion rate of flush toilets
